#### Privacy notice for the survey conducted as part of the research project

This is a privacy notice for the survey conducted in Center for Cultural Policy Research Cupore's research project "Copyright questions in scientific research". The purpose of this document is to provide information on how Cupore processes personal data in connection with conducting the survey.

### 1 Data controller of the research project

The data controller of the research project is Center for Cultural Policy Research Cupore, whose address is Pitkänsillanranta 3 B, FI-00530 Helsinki, Finland.

# 2 Nature of the study

The study will be implemented as a cross-sectional study.

The duration of the entire study is 1 September 2023 to 31 December 2024. The survey will be conducted between 5 February and 31 March 2024.

The data will only be processed by persons belonging to the research group, who are committed to following the Finnish National Board on Research Integrity's guidelines on the Finnish Code of Conduct for Research Integrity and to keeping confidential all personal data processed in the study.

### 4 Purpose and legal basis of the processing of personal data

The personal data contained in the register will be processed as research data in scientific research. The processing of your personal data is necessary for the implementation of scientific research in the public interest on the basis of Article 6(1)(e) of the General Data Protection Regulation and section 4(3) of the Data Protection Act.

The "Copyright questions in scientific research" research project examines the copyright challenges facing universities, higher education institutions and other research organizations when conducting scientific research. The survey conducted as part of the project focuses on researchers' knowledge of

copyright, copyright material used in research, the utilization of artificial intelligence in research work, the availability and open publication of research results, and research ethics problems.

The aim of the study is to provide objectively analyzed and reliable information for the field of higher education and research, public debate and political decision-making. The results will be reported in the form of a research report and published on Cupore's website.

#### 5 Personal data to be collected

The survey material will constitute a dataset containing personal data. In connection with the survey, the following data, among others, will be collected and processed:

- Organization
- Form of employment
- Field(s) of science
- Personal data displayed in open answers

No personal data belonging to special categories or other data subject to special protection will be processed in the study. Only the data necessary for the purpose and implementation of the study will be processed. During the course of the study and the analysis phase, the research data will be processed in a format that prevents you from being directly identifiable to the researchers without additional information. No direct identifiers will be collected in the study. You cannot be identified from the scientific publication or other research results to be published based on the study.

#### 6 Data sources

A survey targeting researchers conducting scientific research in Finland. The link to the survey will be openly shared on Cupore's website, social media channels and through participating partners. Survey respondents will also have the opportunity to share the link further.

# 7 Sensitive personal data

No sensitive personal data will be processed in the study.

# 8 Sharing personal data

The recipients of personal data include the third parties, data controllers and data processors to whom personal data contained in the register are transferred or disclosed.

Data will be disclosed and/or transferred to the following parties:

Data will be transferred to the system providers Webropol (survey platform) and Telia Inmics-Nebula (IT service provider) who will process personal data on behalf of Cupore when providing their platform for Cupore. The system providers will process personal data only to the extent that they participate in the implementation of the controller's service.

Research data containing your personal data can later be utilized in Cupore's other projects or publications. Research data may be disclosed to a third party, such as a scientific publication, for the

peer review process of scientific publication or for other purposes necessary for the validation or publication of scientific research results.

At the end of the research project, the survey data may be transferred to the Data Archive (https://www.fsd.tuni.fi/en/). The Data Archive will then modify the anonymized dataset for long-term storage and further use.

#### 9 Transfer of data outside the EU or EEA

The data will not be transferred outside EU/EEA countries.

## 10 Retention period of personal data

The research data containing personal data (the survey data) will be destroyed in Cupore after five years have passed from the last publication based on the data.

## 11 Personal data protection principles

Your personal data will be processed and stored in secure systems. The computers and information systems used will be protected by user IDs and strong passwords. Access to research data containing personal data will be technologically limited so that only the persons participating in the study and the persons necessary for conducting the study will have access to your personal data.

The data will be stored on Cupore's online data storage, which meets the storage requirements set out in Cupore's data management policy.

### 12 Rights of the subject as a data subject

Where the processing of personal data is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest (scientific research, section 4(3) of the Data Protection Act), the subject shall have:

- Right of access to data
- Right to have data rectified
- Right to restrict the processing of data
- Right to object to the processing of personal data

In the event that the conduct of the study does not require or no longer requires the identification of the data subject, the controller will not be obliged to obtain additional information for the purpose of identifying the data or the data subject solely for the purpose of the exercise of the data subject's rights. If the controller does not identify data that could be linked to a particular data subject, the data subject will not have the right to inspect the data, have the data rectified, object to the processing of the data, or have the data erased. However, these rights will not be restricted if the data subject provides additional information based on which they can be identified in the data.

# 13 Right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority

The data subject has the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority if the data subject considers that the processing of their personal data is in violation of applicable data protection regulations. The national supervisory authority in Finland is the Data Protection Ombudsman (read more: http://www.tietosuoja.fi/en).
